If this default region is judged to be packed too tightly with annotated starts, the track will be further scaled to only show that region of the ORF with annotated starts. This action will be indicated by adding "Zoomed" to the title. For starts, yellow indicates the location of called starts comprised solely of Glimmer/GeneMark auto-annotations, green indicates the location of called starts with at least 1 manual gene annotation.
